- **Walleye Run is On!**

Fisheries staff from the Armuchee office braved the cold, wind, snow, and high lake levels/inflows on Monday morning (3/4) to collect walleye broodstock from the headwaters of Blue Ridge Lake in Fannin County. Despite the conditions, more than 2 dozen walleye were collected, indicating that the spawning run has begun. But, we are probably still a week or two away from the peak of the spawning run. The fish collected here, along with others from other north Georgia lakes, will be spawned at the Go Fish Education Center to produce fingerlings for restocking. Although the Blue Ridge walleye population maintained itself through natural spawning for at least 50+ years, the illegal introduction of blueback herring now severely limits natural reproduction. Stocking is now necessary to keep a fishable population of walleye at Blue Ridge.
